#### **Sundays**

— 10:30 a.m. During this UU-structured time, we light the chalice, offer some inspirational readings, open a space for meditation & peace of mind, share the “joys & concerns” amongst our community, and engage in an exploration of what the message means to you.

We have open discussions, speakers and documentaries on everything from spirituality to science and history. We cover political and ethical issues like feminism and nuclear power.

We also encourage shared creative space with Creative Sundays where we have made prayer journals and vision boards.

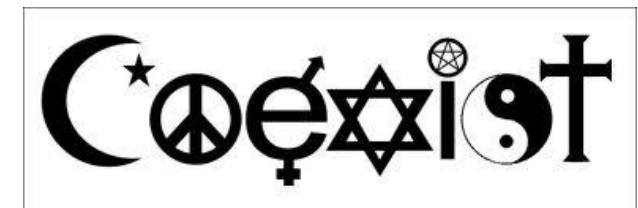
Other groups meeting at the facility include (or have included in the past)...
